## AN OVERVIEW OF PREPARING OLDER YOUTHS FOR SUCCESS (POYS)

The Preparing Older Youth for Success (POYS) Program started over a decade ago under MCFS' Division of Education headed by Mr. Gore Kamara, the Director of Adult Education.

POYS provides GED Instruction for older youths ages 18 to 21 in Delaware County and prepares them to pass the Pennsylvania State General Education Development exam. POYS works with participants to improve literacy levels (minimum of one level), provides job readiness support; opportunities for youths to become certified in Customer Service and/or Home Health Care. Social supports/counseling is available. A new component has been added to the program, temporary subsidized employment opportunities.

POYS participants are enrolled on a rolling basis. Each participant receives up to 1 year of personalized instruction and training and one year of support after completing the program. During enrollment, participants receive assistance in planning and preparing for their long term education, personal and career goals. Light meals and transportation assistance is provided for the duration of program enrollment.

Secondary education is encouraged. Participants receive support if they wish to further their educations at a college or trade school. Participants can become certified in Customer Service.

The certification class gives participants an opportunity to develop and build on

their existing customer service skills. They also review proper office behavior and how to interact with colleagues, skills that are beneficial in any career field. Job readiness training is available through POYS. Participants receive support in the areas of resume' writing, job interviewing skills, job search techniques and obtaining professional attire.

Funding for the POYS program is provided through the Delaware County Workforce Investment Board. A recent donation from the United Way allowed us to increase our capacity and serve more youths through the POYS program. Our increased capacity has been instrumental in increasing enrollment rates and implementing a new critical program component, subsidized employment.

Subsidized employment involves partnering with some local businesses providing a 30 day employment opportunity to POYS participants. MCFS subsidizes the participant's salary and insurance (when applicable). Weekly monitoring is done to ensure the participant is fulfilling their work obligations.

At the end of the trial period, the employer provides feedback on the participant's performance and has the option of offering him/her a permanent position within their company. To date, two jobs have been created through



this initiative.

For the first time in POYS program history, we have an Outreach & Job Specialist, Mr. Laraamond Nyonton (see page 3 for more information on Mr. Nyonton).

POYS is always looking for youths who are ready to pursue their education and career goals. Program eligibility is contingent on the following:

-Must be between the ages of 18 to 21

- -Low Income
- Pregnant or Parenting
- Disability
- Offenders
- Homeless, Runaway or Foster Care

## OUTREACH & JOB SPECIALIST JOINS MCFS' POYS PROGRAM

In the spring of 2014, Laraamand Nyonton decided to attend a meeting organized by the Liberian Association of Pennsylvania (LAP). This decision would impact the trajectory of his career.

MCFS' Director Portia Kamara, who served as a co-chair of LAP 2014 Independence Day Planning Committee, was a presenter at this event. Mr. Nyonton listened as Mrs. Kamara shared the range of services offered at MCFS and the work that the agency does with immigrant families and the surrounding community. He was introduced to Mrs. Kamara by Mr. Don Dennis, President of the Liberian Association of PA. This meeting led to Mr. Nyonton volunteering at MCFS with the Preparing Older Youths for Success (POYS) program. Within two months, he was hired by MCFS in a brand new position as an Outreach & Job Specialist for the POYS program.

The POYS program, under the direction of Mr. Gore Kamara, works with youths ages 18 to 21. Participants have the opportunity to receive personalized instruction in preparation for the GED exam; earn certifications in customer service and/or home care; receive job readiness support; goal planning assistance; social support; guidance in pursuing college or trade school and opportunities for subsidized job placement. Participants receive light meals and transportation assistance.

Mr. Nyonton's personal and educational background has been extremely

beneficial to MCFS. Mr. Nyonton is a proud Liberian who earned his Bachelors Degree in Business Administration with a concentration in Finance from the African Methodist Episcopal University in Monrovia. He has Certifications in effective Communication, Customer Service & Human Relationships and Strategic Quality Planning.

Mr. Nyonton earned his Certifications through a collaborative effort between his home country and the International Finance Corporation (IFC). The IFC's goal is to strengthen the middle class. This is accomplished by providing Liberian Business owners with information on how to develop and sustain their businesses.

Compassion, values, hard work and discipline are attributes instilled in Mr. Nyonton by his parents. His home and community is where he experienced a sense of belong and a connection to his fellow Liberians. His current passion for empowering communities is rooted in his upbringing and is one of the most valuable attributes he brings to the MCFS family.

Mr. Nyonton has used his knowledge of business to provide new ideas on how to increase POYS enrollment. He has also been instrumental in implementing new services for the participants in our POYS program.

Mr. Nyonton has only been at MCFS for a few months and has already made a lasting impact. He has establishing new partnerships with social service agencies in Delaware County, Chester County and parts of Philadelphia County which has contributed to increased enrollment in the POYS program. He has been successful in getting participants placed at subsidized jobs (paid internships) at local businesses which ultimately benefits residents as well as our participants. All of these accomplishments and he has just started in his position.

Ultimately, Mr. Nyonton would like to return to Liberia to finish the work he started during his affiliation with the IFC. He would like to pursue his MBA with a concentration in Finance and become an Investment Planner & Financial Advisor. His supreme goal is to be an inspiration in the lives of those who come across him. He would like others to look at his life and see he is a regular person who experiences many emotions but can see through his situations and fight his way out and continue on the path to achieving his goals. Yes Mr. Nyonton, you are a regular person, but you have the heart of a superhero.

## HELP FULFILL M.D. DREAMS FOR A FORMER MCFS YOUTH

My name is Jack Nutugah and I have been accepted to medical school at the American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine and would like your support to make my dream of becoming a physician a reality.

I traveled an unconventional journey to get into medical school. Thirteen years ago, I immigrated here from Ghana and settled in Upper Darby, Pennsylvania, where I took English as a Second Language (ESL) classes and eventually graduated from Upper Darby High School with honors.

My success in high school and beyond started with the support of an Upper Darby Police Officer who was known to many immigrant youth in the community as, Officer Dave. Officer Dave introduced me to the Multicultural Community Family Services where I became involved in the weekly immigrant youth counseling support group and was a member of the youth soccer team which was composed of other first generation immigration youth.

My lack of a traditional familial support system created a resilience and the drive to pursue higher education. I have always thought of education as an investment. I grew up with a single mother who returned to Ghana due to her health condition before I <u>completed my degree</u> at the University of Pittsburgh. After my mother left, I worked multiple jobs to support myself and my mother. My determination helped me graduate in 2011 with a Bachelors Degree in English Writing and a Chemistry minor.

My determination and persistence has earned me admission to American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine. With your support, I hope to attain my dream of becoming a physician and leader in the movement to eradicate health-care disparity.

I am passionate about working with low-income communities, medically underserved population and those with unusual conditions that serve as a barrier to accessing personal health services. In addition, it is my intent to work with the WHO (World Health Organization) to combat global health-care issues by working to improve the health care infrastructure in developing countries.

As a student with a socio-economic disadvantage background, I have persevered in the face of adversity. I believe I can be of service to other youths with similar situations. Thus, it is my long-term goal to work with youth to inspire and mentor them to never give up working on their dreams despite life's difficulties.

I will also be applying for scholarships and federal aid to cover part of my tuition. All of your sponsorship will go towards my tuition and room and board expenses estimated at \$20,000 per semester.
